#### 1 Introduction

The Business Connectivity Services Deployment Web Service Protocol provides utility functions that can be used in the creation of development or administration tools and applications that interact with Business Connectivity Services solutions.

Sections 1.5, 1.8, 1.9, 2, and 3 of this specification are normative. All other sections and examples in this specification are informative.

#### 1.1 Glossary

This document uses the following terms:

- **Action**: A type of **MetadataObject** that represents a URL that triggers the display or manipulation of data related to an Entity or EntityInstance. Actions are contained by an Entity. Actions contain **ActionParameters**.
- **ActionParameter**: A type of **MetadataObject** that defines how to parameterize the URL of an **Action** with specific data about an EntityInstance. ActionParameters are contained by Actions.
- **certificate**: A certificate is a collection of attributes (1) and extensions that can be stored persistently. The set of attributes in a certificate can vary depending on the intended usage of the certificate. A certificate securely binds a public key to the entity that holds the corresponding private key. A certificate is commonly used for authentication (2) and secure exchange of information on open networks, such as the Internet, extranets, and intranets. Certificates are digitally signed by the issuing certification authority (CA) and can be issued for a user, a computer, or a service. The most widely accepted format for certificates is defined by the ITU-T X.509 version 3 international standards. For more information about attributes and extensions, see [RFC3280] and [X509] sections 7 and 8.
- **Creator**: A type of MethodInstance that can be called to create a new EntityInstance. The set of Fields that are required to create the EntityInstance is referred to as the Creator View.
- **deployment package**: A collection of files that can be used to deploy and manage customizations, such as add-ins, to a computer. It consists of an application manifest, a deployment manifest, and related package files.
- **external content type**: A type of DataClass object that is stored in a line-of-business (LOB) system and whose instances have a persistent EntityInstanceId. Also referred to as Entity.
- **external list**: A container that is within a SharePoint site and that references a set of EntityInstances that are sourced from a line-of-business (LOB) system. It has a customizable schema that is composed of one or more Fields (4).
- **farm**: A group of computers that work together as a single system to help ensure that applications and resources are available. Also referred to as server farm.
- file: A single, discrete unit of content.
- **folder**: A file system construct. File systems organize a volume's data by providing a hierarchy of objects, which are referred to as folders or directories, that contain files and can also contain other folders.

- **form**: A document with a set of controls into which users can enter information. Controls on a form can be bound to elements in the data source of the form, such as fields and groups. See also bind.
- **form template**: A file or set of files that defines the data structure, appearance, and behavior of a **form**.
- **form template (.xsn) file**: A cabinet (.cab) file with an .xsn file name extension that contains the files that comprise a form template.
- **globally unique identifier (GUID)**: A term used interchangeably with universally unique identifier (UUID) in Microsoft protocol technical documents (TDs). Interchanging the usage of these terms does not imply or require a specific algorithm or mechanism to generate the value. Specifically, the use of this term does not imply or require that the algorithms described in [RFC4122] or [C706] must be used for generating the **GUID**. See also universally unique identifier (UUID).
- **GUIDString**: A **GUID** in the form of an ASCII or Unicode string, consisting of one group of 8 hexadecimal digits, followed by three groups of 4 hexadecimal digits each, followed by one group of 12 hexadecimal digits. It is the standard representation of a GUID, as described in [RFC4122] section 3. For example, "6B29FC40-CA47-1067-B31D-00DD010662DA". Unlike a curly braced GUID string, a GUIDString is not enclosed in braces.
- **Hypertext Transfer Protocol (HTTP)**: An application-level protocol for distributed, collaborative, hypermedia information systems (text, graphic images, sound, video, and other multimedia files) on the World Wide Web.
- **Hypertext Transfer Protocol Secure (HTTPS)**: An extension of HTTP that securely encrypts and decrypts web page requests. In some older protocols, "Hypertext Transfer Protocol over Secure Sockets Layer" is still used (Secure Sockets Layer has been deprecated). For more information, see [SSL3] and [RFC5246].
- **Identifier**: The Field (4) or Fields (4) that define the Identity of an EntityInstance. Also referred to as Key.
- **LobSystem**: A type of **MetadataObject** that represents a specific version of a line-of business (LOB) system. An LOB system can be a database or a web service.
- **MetadataObject**: An abstract data structure that consists of a set of attributes (1) that represent a LobSystem, LobSystemInstance, DataClass, Entity, Method, MethodInstance, Parameter, TypeDescriptor, Identifier, FilterDescriptor, **Action, ActionParameter**, or Association.
- **profile page**: An ASP.NET webpage that includes Web Part controls that display data from a line-of-business (LOB) system. By default, it contains a single Web Part that displays the details of a single, primary EntityInstance. If the primary Entity has associated Entities and is the source of an Association, the profile page also contains a related Web Part for each associated Entity, and each related Web Part displays EntityInstances that are associated with the primary EntityInstance.
- **site**: A group of related pages and data within a SharePoint site collection. The structure and content of a site is based on a site definition. Also referred to as SharePoint site and web site.
- **SOAP**: A lightweight protocol for exchanging structured information in a decentralized, distributed environment. **SOAP** uses XML technologies to define an extensible messaging framework, which provides a message construct that can be exchanged over a variety of underlying protocols. The framework has been designed to be independent of any particular programming model and other implementation-specific semantics. SOAP 1.2 supersedes SOAP 1.1. See [SOAP1.2-1/2003].

- **SOAP action**: The HTTP request header field used to indicate the intent of the **SOAP** request, using a URI value. See [SOAP1.1] section 6.1.1 for more information.
- **SOAP body**: A container for the payload data being delivered by a SOAP message to its recipient. See [SOAP1.2-1/2007] section 5.3 for more information.
- **SOAP fault**: A container for error and status information within a SOAP message. See [SOAP1.2-1/2007] section 5.4 for more information.
- **solution package**: A compressed file that can be deployed to a server farm or a site. It can contain assemblies, resource files, site and feature definitions, templates, code access security policies, and Web Parts. Solution packages have a .wsp file name extension.
- **Updater**: A type of MethodInstance that can be called to update an EntityInstance identified by a specified EntityInstanceId. The set of Fields (4) that is required to update the EntityInstance is referred to as the Updater View.
- **view**: See form view (Microsoft InfoPath), list view (SharePoint Products and Technologies), or View (Microsoft Business Connectivity Services).
- **Web Part Page**: An ASP.NET webpage that includes Web Part controls that enable users to customize the page, such as specifying which information to display. Referred to as Web Parts Page in Microsoft SharePoint Foundation 2010.
- web service: A unit of application logic that provides data and services to other applications and can be called by using standard Internet transport protocols such as HTTP, Simple Mail Transfer Protocol (SMTP), or File Transfer Protocol (FTP). Web services can perform functions that range from simple requests to complicated business processes.
- **Web Services Description Language (WSDL)**: An XML format for describing network services as a set of endpoints that operate on messages that contain either document-oriented or procedure-oriented information. The operations and messages are described abstractly and are bound to a concrete network protocol and message format in order to define an endpoint. Related concrete endpoints are combined into abstract endpoints, which describe a network service. WSDL is extensible, which allows the description of endpoints and their messages regardless of the message formats or network protocols that are used.
- **WSDL** message: An abstract, typed definition of the data that is communicated during a **WSDL** operation [WSDL]. Also, an element that describes the data being exchanged between web service providers and clients.
- **WSDL operation**: A single action or function of a web service. The execution of a WSDL operation typically requires the exchange of messages between the service requestor and the service provider.
- **XML namespace**: A collection of names that is used to identify elements, types, and attributes in XML documents identified in a URI reference [RFC3986]. A combination of XML namespace and local name allows XML documents to use elements, types, and attributes that have the same names but come from different sources. For more information, see [XMLNS-2ED].
- XML namespace prefix: An abbreviated form of an XML namespace, as described in [XML].
- **XML schema**: A description of a type of XML document that is typically expressed in terms of constraints on the structure and content of documents of that type, in addition to the basic syntax constraints that are imposed by XML itself. An XML schema provides a view of a document type at a relatively high level of abstraction.
- MAY, SHOULD, MUST, SHOULD NOT, MUST NOT: These terms (in all caps) are used as defined in [RFC2119]. All statements of optional behavior use either MAY, SHOULD, or SHOULD NOT.

#### 1.3 Overview

This protocol defines three operations that allow a protocol client to perform the following tasks:

- Create a profile page for an existing external content type
- Retrieve a list of deployment package locations that are associated with a set of server-side objects
- Associate a form with an external list

Profile pages represent an instance of an external content type. For example, a customer record in a business application or in search results. The protocol client can use the profile page creation operation to initiate the generation of a profile page for a specific business data object. Typical clients for this protocol are administrative tools for the protocol server or design tools for data modeling.

In some scenarios, it is desirable to associate with a server object deployment packages that represent additional capabilities to be used on a client. The process that is used to retrieve a list of deployment packages is designed for this scenario. This process allows the protocol client to send a collection of identifiers for external lists to the protocol server and to receive from the protocol server a list of deployment package locations. A typical scenario for using this protocol is a Web application that displays business data that is also useful on clients. One example of such a client is a contact management application that provides data caching to support use cases in which a network connection is only occasional.

To support the advanced data validation or UI customization of list data, it is often desirable to replace standard forms with custom forms. This protocol enables a protocol client to associate a custom form at a known location with a list on the protocol server. This protocol also enables a protocol client to map the create, view, and update actions of the list to the actions that the custom form supplies.

#### 1.4 Relationship to Other Protocols

This protocol uses the **SOAP** message protocol for formatting request and response messages, as described in [SOAP1.1], [SOAP1.2/1] and [SOAP1.2/2]. It transmits those messages by using **HTTP**, as described in [RFC2616], or **Hypertext Transfer Protocol over Secure Sockets Layer (HTTPS)**, as described in [RFC2818].

The following diagram shows the underlying messaging and transport stack used by the protocol:




Figure 1: This protocol in relation to other protocols

#### 1.5 Prerequisites/Preconditions

This protocol operates against a **site** that is identified by a URL that protocol clients recognize. The protocol server endpoint is formed by appending "/\_vti\_bin/PublishService.asmx" to the URL of the site; for example, http://www.example.com/Repository/\_vti\_bin/PublishService.asmx.

This protocol assumes that the underlying protocols perform authentication.

The profile page creation and the form association processes include operations to create and modify server objects. This protocol requires the protocol client to have the permissions that enable the creation or modification of server objects.

#### 1.6 Applicability Statement

None.

#### 1.7 Versioning and Capability Negotiation

**Supported transports:** This protocol uses multiple transports with SOAP, as described in section 2.1.

#### 1.8 Vendor-Extensible Fields

None.

#### 1.9 Standards Assignments

This protocol uses standard Internet Assigned Numbers Authority (IANA) port assignments for HTTP, HTTP Alternate, SOCKS, Secure Sockets Layer (SSL), and Secure Socket Tunneling Protocol (SSTP). These standard port assignments use IANA-assigned ports, as shown in the following table.

## 2 Messages

In the following sections, the schema definition might differ from the processing rules imposed by the protocol. The **WSDL** in this specification matches the WSDL that shipped with the product and provides a base description of the schema. The text that introduces the WSDL might specify differences that reflect actual Microsoft product behavior. For example, the schema definition might allow for an element to be **empty**, **null**, or **not present** but the behavior of the protocol as specified restricts the same elements to being **non-empty**, **not null**, and **present**.

#### 2.1 Transport

The protocol MUST support SOAP over HTTP. To help secure communication with protocol clients, the protocol SHOULD additionally support SOAP over HTTPS.

Protocol messages MUST be formatted as specified in [SOAP1.1] section 4. Protocol server faults MUST be returned either by using HTTP Status Codes as specified in [RFC2616] section 10, or by using **SOAP faults** as specified in [SOAP1.1] section 4.4.

#### 2.2 Common Message Syntax

This section contains common definitions that are used by this protocol. The syntax of the definitions uses **XML schema**, as specified in [XMLSCHEMA1] and [XMLSCHEMA2], and WSDL, as specified in [WSDL].

#### 2.2.1 Namespaces

This specification defines and references various **XML namespaces** using the mechanisms specified in [XMLNS]. Although this specification associates a specific **XML namespace prefix** for each XML namespace that is used, the choice of any particular XML namespace prefix is implementation-specific and not significant for interoperability.

#### 3 Protocol Details

In the following sections, the schema definition might differ from the processing rules imposed by the protocol. The WSDL in this specification matches the WSDL that shipped with the product and provides a base description of the schema. The text that introduces the WSDL might specify differences that reflect actual Microsoft product behavior. For example, the schema definition might allow for an element to be **empty**, **null**, or **not present** but the behavior of the protocol as specified restricts the same elements to being **non-empty**, **not null**, and **present**.

This protocol operates between a protocol client and a protocol server. The protocol server does not retain any state.

The client side of this protocol is simply a pass-through. That is, no additional timers or other state is required on the client side of this protocol. Calls made by the higher-layer protocol or application are passed directly to the transport, and the results returned by the transport are passed directly back to the higher-layer protocol or application.

Except where specified, protocol clients SHOULD interpret the HTTP status codes that are returned by the protocol server as specified in <a href="[RFC2616]">[RFC2616]</a> section 10 Status Code Definitions.

This protocol allows protocol servers to notify protocol clients of application-level faults by using SOAP faults. Except where specified, these SOAP faults are not significant for interoperability, and protocol clients can interpret them in an implementation-specific manner.

This protocol allows protocol servers to perform implementation-specific authorization checks and to notify protocol clients of authorization faults, either by using HTTP status codes or by using SOAP faults as specified earlier in this section.

#### 3.1 Server Details

#### 3.1.1 Abstract Data Model

This section describes a conceptual model of possible data organization that an implementation maintains to participate in this protocol. The described organization is provided to facilitate the explanation of how the protocol behaves. This document does not mandate that implementations adhere to this model as long as their external behavior is consistent with that described in this document.

The protocol server maintains the following data:

- A site with which the Web service is associated
- A collection of folders
- A collection of form templates that conform to the form template format specified in [MS-IPFF2]
- A collection of Web Part Pages
- A collection of external lists
- A collection of actions for each external list
- A collection of views for each external list
- A URL that specifies the site that hosts profile pages. All profile pages will be generated on this site.

The protocol server maintains a collection of the following MetadataObject artifacts:

- A collection of LobSystem
- A collection of LobSystem properties associated with each LobSystem
- A collection of external content types, each of which is contained in a LobSystem

The protocol server has to follow the following rules:

- Each external content type is identified by the combination of namespace and name.
- Each external content type has a version number.
- An external content type can have another external content type associated with it.
- Each external list has a **GUID**.
- Each external list is associated with a folder, and each folder is not associated with more than one
  external list.
- Each folder associated with an external list has a folder named Item, and each folder named Item can have a folder named Form.
- Each form template is contained in an Item folder.
- Each external list is based on an external content type.
- Each external list has three special actions for creating, viewing, and updating the items of the list, and each of the actions has a URL that points to one of the Web Part Pages.

The protocol client sends a **CreateProfilePageSoapIn** request WSDL message. The protocol server MUST respond with a **CreateProfilePageSoapOut** response message, as follows:

- The protocol client MUST specify the namespace and the name of the external content type for which the profile page will be created.
- The protocol server MUST<1> generate a profile page for the particular external content type with an implementation specific URL<2>.

If the protocol server returns a SOAP fault as specified in [SOAP1.1] section 4.4, the SOAP fault MUST include a fault code value of Server as specified in [SOAP1.1] section 4.4.1. The protocol server MUST return this SOAP fault when any of the following occur:

- The namespace or the name of the external content type is not specified.
- The namespace or the name of the external content type is an empty string.
- The namespace or the name of the external content type has more than 255 Unicode characters.
- The external content type of the particular namespace and name cannot be found.
- The site that hosts profile pages is not specified.
- The site (2) that hosts profile pages does not exist.
- The site that hosts profile pages does not have access to the external content type specified by the namespace and name.
- The user performing the client protocol does not have permission to create, edit, and remove a page on the site (2) that hosts profile pages.

If the deployment package of an external list does not exist or the external list has been modified since the deployment package was generated, this operation MUST also generate a new deployment package for the external list. The deployment packages MUST conform to the format specified in both [MS-BCSDPFFS] and [MS-OSCO].

The protocol client sends a **GetPackagesSoapIn** request WSDL message. The protocol server SHOULD<u><4></u> respond with a **GetPackagesSoapOut** response WSDL message. The sequence is as follows:

- The protocol client MUST specify the identifiers of a collection of external lists for which the deployment package information will be returned.
- If the protocol server determines that the deployment package of an external list does not exist, the protocol server MUST generate a deployment package for the external list.
- If there is a deployment package for an external list, the protocol server MUST check whether changes were made to the external list after the deployment package was generated. When any of the following changes occur, the protocol server MUST generate a new deployment package:
  - A file is added to the Item or Form folder that is associated with the external list.
  - A file contained in the Item or Form folder that is associated with the external list is modified.
  - A view of the external list is changed.
  - A view is created for the external list.
  - A view of the external list is removed.
  - The version of the external content type of the external list is changed.

- The version of an external content type that is associated with the external content type of the list is changed.
- A new external content type is associated with the external content type of the list.
- The value of the "LastModifiedTimestamp" property of the LobSystem that contains either the
  external content type of the list or its associated external content types is changed.
- The protocol server MUST return the information about the deployment packages that correspond to the external lists.

If the protocol server returns a SOAP fault as specified in [SOAP1.1] section 4.4, the SOAP fault MUST include a fault code value of Server as specified in [SOAP1.1] section 4.4.1. The protocol server MUST return this SOAP fault when any of the following occur:

- The protocol server does not support this operation.
- The list of identifiers is not specified.
- The list of identifiers is empty.
- The identifiers are not a GUIDString or a curly braced GUID string.
- The external list that is specified by any identifier does not exist on the site that is associated with the Web service.
- The site that is associated with this Web service allows anonymous access.

If the user performing the client protocol does not have read permission on the site or the external lists, the server MUST return HTTP status code 401 as specified in [RFC2616] section 10.

If the external content type does not have an Action with the name "View Profile", the server creates one. The URL of the Action is set to specify the profile page and for each Identifier of the external content type an ActionParameter is created with the same name as the Identifier. In case the external content type has an Action with the name "View Profile", if the Action has a property Office Version and the property value is 14, the Action will be reused. All the ActionParameters of the Action are removed and a new ActionParameter is created with the same name as the Identifier for each Identifier. If the property Office Version does not exist or the property value is not 14, the Action is renamed to "View Profile (SharePoint 2007)". A new Action with the name "View Profile" is

created, and for each **Identifier** of the external content type an ActionParameter is created with the same name as the **Identifier**. In both cases, the URL of the "View Profile" **Action** is set to specify the profile page.

<2> Section 3.1.4.1: Search Server 2010 Express, Search Server 2010, FAST Search Server 2010 for SharePoint Internet Sites, FAST Search Server 2010 for SharePoint, SharePoint 2010 FIS Enterprise, SharePoint 2010 FIS Standard and SharePoint Server 2010 construct a profile page URL as follows. The server first checks the default Action of the external content type. If the default **Action** name is "View Profile" and the **Action** URL refers to a file in the folder bdc/<encoded-namespace> of the site that hosts profile pages, the server constructs the profile page URL by using the schema, authority, and path of the **Action** URL. The *encoded-namespace* is a string generated from the namespace of the external content type as follows: first replace with  $'\_'$  the invalid characters  $(`\sim', `\#', `\%', `\&', `\{', `\}'$  and `.'), then percent-encode the result and finally truncate the encoded string to at most 128 characters without breaking in the middle of a percent-encoding triplet, for example, "%25". If a file with the same URL exists, the file will be overwritten. If the default **Action** name is not "View Profile", or the **Action** URL refers to a file that is not in the folder as specified in this paragraph, the server generates the profile page URL as <site-url>/\_bdc/<encoded-namespace>/<encodedname>\_<version-tag>.aspx, where site-url is the URL of the site hosting profile pages, encoded-name is a string generated from the external content type name in the same way as encoded-namespace, except that the encoded string is truncated to no more than 124 characters, and version tag is an integer. The profile page URL is first constructed by using 1 as the **version** tag. If a file exists with the same URL, the server keeps constructing a new URL by increasing the **version** tag until either no file with the same URL exists or the version tag is 999. In the latter case, the existing file will be overwritten.

<3> Section 3.1.4.1: Search Server 2010 Express, Search Server 2010, FAST Search Server 2010 for SharePoint Internet Sites, FAST Search Server 2010 for SharePoint, SharePoint 2010 FIS Enterprise, SharePoint 2010 FIS Standard and SharePoint Server 2010 return a SOAP fault if the site that hosts profile pages is not in the local **farm**.
