Microsoft web browsers support the *Web Content Accessibility Guidelines (WCAG) 2.1* [\[W3C-WCAG21-20180605\]](#) specifications, published 05 June 2018, with no variations, clarifications, or extensions.

The supported specification defines how to make Web content more accessible to people with disabilities. Microsoft browsers support this recommendation as it pertains to browser implementors.
